

1946 UNITED STATES CHAMPIONSHIPS

From Skating News, September 1946



About six thousand roller skaters and their families converged on New York City for the 1946 National Championships which took place at Gay Blades June 24 through June 28. Considerable cooperation was received from all civic departments, hotels, and so forth, with the exception of the weather man who brought one of the warmest spells of the season-as if to provide a real torrid atmosphere for the hot contests.

With the thermometer standing at 100 degrees, the competitions got under way bright and early and, best of all, on time, Monday morning, June 24, with some fine speed skating preliminary races.

Henry Kirsche and Joan Westenberg of Wal-Cliffe, Elmont, NY, really mopped up the Junior Division. They won the Dance, Pairs, and Henry won the Boys' Figure event. Joan was in the money in the hot Junior Girls' Figure event but was topped by Nancy Lee Parker of Detroit and Kunnie Mae Williams of Cleveland. The personal competition of these two youngsters (formerly teammates) left the others well back.

Those Cincinnati speed skaters from Sefferino's did a bang-up job, too. They rolled up the Intermediate Boys, Senior Ladies, Intermediate Ladies, Junior Girls events and took enough OTHER places to make

Columbus (Ohio) Skateland also set an enviable pace with Intermediate Dance champs and runners-up in Senior and Novice Dance. Teddy Shufflebarger of Berthana at Ogden, Utah, smashed through the Senior Men's Figures to win for the West, and Margaret Williams McMillan, Cleveland Skateland, topped the Senior Ladies' event. Robert Gormley of Arcadia, Chicago, came out on top in the Novice Men's event.

Norman Latin and Peggy Wallace of Park Circle, Brooklyn, did another impossible job to win at Intermediate Singles and Pairs, and what a beautiful job they did!


