Since the very first roller skate, inventors continue to experiment with the design of a roller skate creating many odd and unusual skates. The most popular design experiments occur with the size, shape and placement of the skate wheels. Other inventors set out to design a skate for a specific purpose such as a motorized skate for speed or skates on stilts for entertainment shows. Skating on these skates may not have been the easiest but the designs make these skates some of the most interesting.
